Chester Active Travel Festival

Born out of a desire to improve the city for all residents, Chester's first Active Travel Festival will take place on

Sunday, June 18th on the Castle Car Park and along Castle Drive, from 11:00 -16:00.

Getting to the Festival

It would be fantastic if families could learn about the active travel options into Chester by cycling, wheeling or walking to the festival on Sunday. The choice of route to be taken is very much the decision of each family group, but THIS ROUTE has been identified as the Quietest - *ATfest* signs will direct to the festival site once in the city centre (this route uses the Black cycle route, part of the wider Chester network – click HERE for more information).

The organisers are hoping that as many school children and families as possible will join in this event to increase awareness of the active travel options available to all of us, to travel into Chester in a way that is good for our health and good for the environment as well.

The centre is named after HMS Conway, a naval training ship moored for many years in the Menai Straits, and replaced by the current onshore facility adjacent to Plas Newydd in the 1960s (which was subsequently acquired by Cheshire as an outdoor centre).

Health, Safety and Wellbeing

Nut free school

There are several children in school for whom contact with food items containing nuts, in any form, could provoke anaphylactic shock and even prove fatal. Please do not allow your children to bring any such products into school, in their packed lunch or as a breaktime snack (e.g. Nutella bars, walnuts).

Earrings

Section 9 of the <u>School Uniform Policy</u> makes the limitations on jewellery worn to school clear – in particular, only stud earrings may be worn, and certainly not hoop earrings, which in PE lessons especially could lead to serious injury for the wearer (during the initial period when they cannot be removed) and/or needless disruption later on when removing them to a safe place prior to the lesson.
