Spent over the grant amount by £1740

Almost half of the overspend resulted from extending tutor tuition to Reception classes, who are not funded by the grant: cost for these 2 classes = £800. Y5 and Y6 also benefited from half a term's extra gym tuition, totalling £350.

Impact of premium use

Impact on pupils' participation: inter-school competition, and after-school clubs, funded by the premium, encourage and enable pupils to take part in a wide range of sports.

Impact on pupils' attainment: all children are able to participate in a broad and balanced PE curriculum.

How the school will sustain the improvements: resourcing, and especially training, funded by the premium, will enable the positive impact to be sustained over time, as teachers are able to apply the lessons learned observing specialist tutors.
